“COUNT OF THE HAAB” CLAUSES:

1. East. Cop. Q, D₃–C₄.
2. North? Cop. 6, C₅.
3. West. Nar. 24, E₉–D₁₀.
4. South. Quir. J, C₉–D₉.

AFFIXES DENOTING “EXPIRATION”:

5. Distance number introductory glyph with flattened fish-head prefix; death eyes and hair postfix. Cop. A, B_{11a}.
6. Head form of distance number introductory glyph with death eyes and hair as prefix and postfix. Cop. T 11, E door, N panel, A₁.
7. Distance number introductory glyph with skull as prefix; hair and eyes as postfix. Cop. N, B₉.
8. God C in sky elbow with skull as prefix. Pal. Cross, W panel of entrance.
9. Glyph B of lunar series with death eyes and hair as prefix; with oval as postfix. Quir. I, A_{6a}.
10. Head of death god with death or night eye before forehead. Cop. I, C₁.

SUFFIXES WITH PERIOD GLYPHS:

11. Normal form of symbolic variant of tun. Pal. Cross, B₅.
12. Tun and katun, former with distance number postfix. Quir. C, C₁₁.
13. “Expiration 5 tuns” with anniversary form of postfix. Yax. L 2, D₁.
14. “First katun” with anniversary form of postfix. P.N. L 3, G₁.
15. “Completion of count of 15 katuns” without postfix. Cop. 4, B₇.

MOON AS SYMBOL FOR TWENTY IN DISTANCE NUMBERS:

16. With coefficient of 11: 31 days. Balak. 5, D₁₀.
17. With coefficient completion sign: 20 days. Pal. Cross, B₁₃.
18. With coefficient of 3: 23 days. P.N. L 3, Z₁.

WEST:

19. Dresden 45c.

“TU” PREFIX:

20. Usual winged cauac as haab. Quir. E, C_{11b}.
21. “Tu haab” anniversary glyph. Cop. 8, E₁.
22. “In 5 tu haab in katun 1 Ahau.” Yula 1, B₂–A₄.
23. “On the twelfth of Cumku.” Chichen 27, B₁.

SNAKE OR EEL AFFIX AS ANTERIOR DATE INDICATOR:

24. Pal. Inscr. (W), E₈.
25. Pal. Inscr. (E), M₇.
26. Xcal. North Building.

HEAD FORMS OF TUN SIGNS:

27. Personified cauac with “tail.” Quir. F, C₁₁.
28. Moan-bird variant. Pal. Inscr. (E), R₃.

VULTURE HEAD REPLACING “TI” ELEMENT IN ANTERIOR DATE INDICATORS:

29. *Xoc* main element becomes prefix; “*ti*” postfix becomes main element as head of vulture with “*ti*” element above beak. Quir. J, E₃.
30. Vulture head with “*ti*” element apparently as main element. Cop. HS, fragment (Gordon, pl. 13, row D).

KIN GLYPH AS INDICATOR OF DAY SIGNS:

31. 9 Lamat, kin. Chichen 2, A₁–B₁.
32. 8 Manik, kin, tu. Chichen 4, A₁–B₁.
33. 7 Muluc, kin. Xcal. IS, A₈–B₈.
34. 2 Chuen, end kin. Kabah jamb, A₁–B₁.

PHRASES:

35. “9 Etz’nab, kin, tu buluc Yax ichil 13 haab, ichil 1 Ahau.” Chichen 5, A₁–A₄.
36. “6 Ahau 13 Muan, completion of count of 14 katuns, the count of the tun.” Tik. 16, A₁–A₅.
37. “Completion of the haab. 1 Ahau 8 Kayab, the seating of the haab. The tenth katun, half a period completed, a tun.” Pal. Inscr. (E), R₁₂–T₃.
