1. Xcal. north temple, east column. First two glyphs may record: Haab 1, 13 Ahau, probably a reference to a date falling in tun ending on 9.14.1.0.0. Note style of glyphs.
2. Yax. 7. Noncalendrical glyphs on front.
3. Tila C. IS 9.13.0.0.0 8 Ahau 8 Uo.
4. Yax. L 30. The text is carried forward from L 29 and the first column is E. There is recorded a base in the 819-day count at 1 Ben 1 Ch'en:

5. Yax. L 14. Opening pair of glyphs are 4 Imix 4 Mol, probably referable to 9.15.10.0.1. They are followed by the glyph of the hand grasping fish. Note half-speckled Ahau with *u* postfix at B4.
6. Yax. 11. IS records 9.16.1.0.0 11 Ahau 8 Zec with glyphs G9, F, 6Y, 12D, 5C (perhaps 4C), X, B, 9A. Note tied-up lunar glyph as on L 30 and *te* (1) prefix with tun and 8 Zec. "Ben-Ich" katun with possible coefficient of 5 is also recorded. (Courtesy of Peabody Museum, Harvard University.)



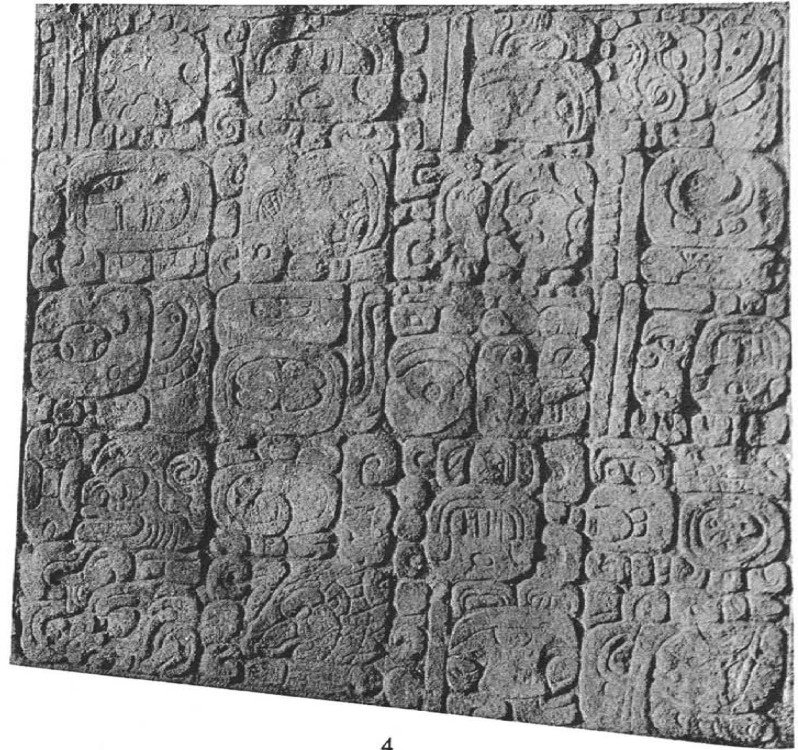
