2. Bone and jade alternating to form frame. Pal. Palace, House D, Pier f.
3. Completion and jade alternating to form frame. Pal. Palace, House D, Pier c.
4. Kan cross with jade and bone attachments. Pal. Fol. Cross, side of sanctuary.
5. Yax and jade alternating to form frame. Pal. Palace, House D, Pier d.
- 6,9. Flower elements attached to kan cross. Pal. Palace, House E, mural in west room.
7. Head of earth monster with kan cross on forehead, from which grows maize plant. Pal. Fol. Cross.
8. Head of long-nosed earth monster of no. 7 with kan cross, jade, bone, and yax symbols.
10. Long-nosed monster joined to completion sign. Tik. 1, base of south side.
11. Kan cross and jade alternating to form frame. Pal. Palace, House D, Pier e.
12. Flower element attached to jade bead. Pal. Palace, House E, mural in west room.
13. Yax and kan cross symbol. Dresden 18c.
14. Goddess carrying yax and kan cross in pack on her back. Dresden 18c.

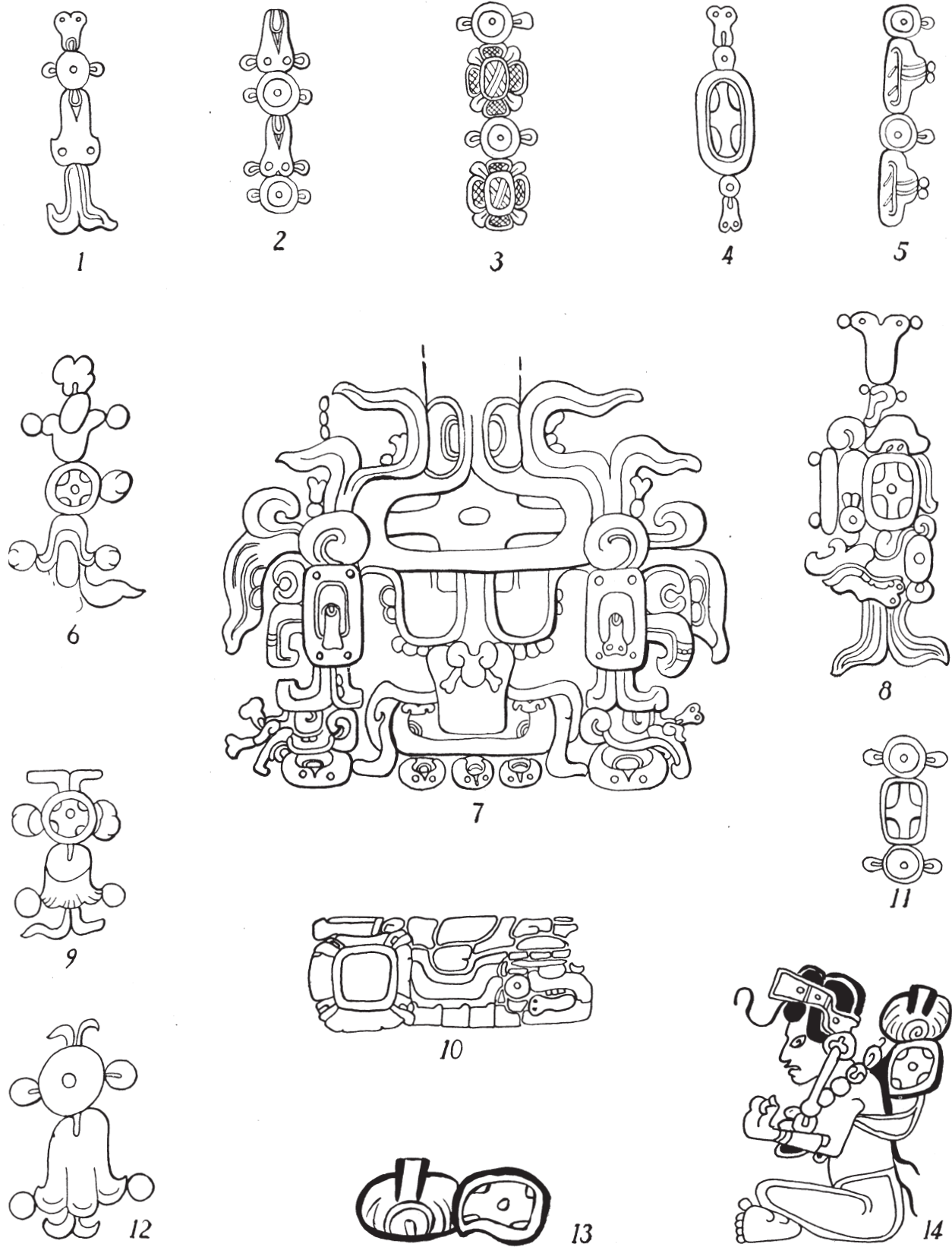
